WITHIN 30 MINUTES



1 CHERTSEY, 5 MINS

This historic market town sits on the Thames with the 18th century Chertsey Bridge crossing the river. Home to a number of listed buildings, including the Cedars which houses Chertsey Museum, and plenty of independent shops, bars and restaurants.



2 GREAT COCKROW RAILWAY, 5 MINS

The most extensive miniature steam railway of its kind in the country.

3 THE FARM SHOP LYNE, 5 MINS

Offers locally grown fruit and veg, a traditional butchers shop and a popular café.

4 FOXHILLS COUNTRY CLUB AND RESORT, 5 MINS

The award-winning Foxhills spans 400 hectares of country estate, with three golf courses, a spa, five swimming pools and three restaurants.



5 HOMWOOD PARK, 5 MINS

23 hectares of nature trails, pathways, cycle routes, horse trails and woodlands surrounding the grade II listed Botleys Mansion. The park is designed to echo the original landscape surrounding the Botley Manor Mansion of the later 1700s.




6 CHERTSEY MEADS, 10 MINS

71 hectares of wildflower meadow on the banks of the Thames, Chertsey Meads is a wide open space popular with families and dog walkers alike. The annual Chertsey agricultural show is held on the meads - a popular local event hosting a variety of displays and attractions, such as horse jumping, which is well worth a visit.

7 CHOBHAM COMMON, 10 MINS

The largest National Nature Reserve in the southeast of England and one of the finest remaining examples of lowland heath in the world.



8 STAINES-UPON -THAMES 10 MINS

A bustling town with its impressive retail areas of The Elmsleigh Centre and Two Rivers.

9 THORPE PARK RESORT, 10 MINS

Home to exciting rides, attractions and live events – a great day out with the grandkids or if you're a bit of a thrill seeker!

10 WEYBRIDGE, 15 MINS

A beautiful town with scenic walks along the riverside and shopping on the stylish Baker's Street.



11 MERCEDES-BENZ WORLD, 15 MINS

Exhibitions and displays giving an insight into the heritage, innovation and engineering behind Mercedes-Benz. Driving experiences and tours also available.

12 RUNNYMEDE AND ANKERWYCKE, 15 MINS

Runnymede is famous as the site of the sealing of Magna Carta. It is home to memorials to John F. Kennedy and the Commonwealth Air Forces, and a unique installation by artists Hew Locke and Mark Wallinger.

On the other side of the Thames is Ankerwycke, where you'll find the ruins of a Benedictine priory and the National Trust's oldest tree – a 2,500 year old Yew.



14 WINDSOR GREAT PARK, 15 MINS

Discover a Royal history spanning over 1,000 years, including historical monuments, ancient forests and stunning horticultural displays, as well as rare wildlife, and plants. The Park is home to:

- Virginia Water – a spectacular lake originally created as a Royal pleasure ground
- The Valley Gardens – an enchanting woodland of twisting trails and flowers
- The Long Walk and Deer Park – an impressive three-mile long tree-lined avenue
- The Savill Garden – one of Britain's greatest ornamental gardens

A vast garden home to one of the largest plant collections anywhere in the world. It has a glasshouse with 3 climatic zones and 240 acres of beautiful gardens to explore.

22 SOUTH HILL PARK, 25 MINS

24 KEMPTON PARK RACECOURSE, 25 MINS

Opened in 1878, Kempton Park is one of the most active racecourses in the UK. It's famously home of the Christmas jumping showpiece, the King George VI Chase, and plays host to over 90 fixtures a year – meaning there's something for everyone.



25 WINDSOR CASTLE, 30 MINS

The oldest and largest occupied castle in the world Founded by William the Conqueror in the 11th century, it has since been the home of 39 monarchs.

26 GUILDFORD, 30 MINS

This historic and vibrant county town has a striking cathedral, a castle, picturesque riverside walks and plenty of shops and eateries down cobbled streets and alleys.

This award-winning luxury English Gin is handcrafted with 24 botanicals, and is distilled and bottled in the beautiful Surrey Hills. Join a tour to discover more about Silent Pool and the history of Gin, and finish with a tasting of the full range.

28 POLESDEN LACEY, 30 MINS

This Edwardian country retreat in a 1,500-acre estate dates back to Roman times and boasts elegant gardens and stunning views over the Surrey Hills. The house was the weekend retreat of Margaret Greville, who was a wealthy and discerning collector of art and objects, and who played host to royalty and celebrities of the past.

29 FARNBOROUGH, 30 MINS

World-famous for the bi-annual International Air Show, where thousands of people visit. The Farnborough Aerodrome is renowned for its long-standing aviation links and pioneering work, from the first powered flight in Britain in 1908 to the first car to go supersonic on land in 1997.

30 STRAWBERRY HILL HOUSE AND GARDENS, 30 MINS

Beginning life as a modest house in 1698 it was transformed into 'a little Gothic castle' by Horace Walpole in the 18th century. He doubled its size, creating Gothic rooms and adding towers and battlements in fulfilment of his dream. It's now internationally famous as Britain's finest example of Georgian Gothic revival.

35 TITSEY PLACE AND GARDENS, 45 MINS

A magnificent historic manor house with impressive formal gardens, lakes, walled kitchen garden and park offering panoramic views.

39 READING, 50 MINS


Reading dates back to medieval times, shaped by the River Thames and Kennet that encircle the town centre. The town boasts six museums and the ancient Abbey Ruins – burial place of Henry I – as well as being one of the UK's top shopping destinations.



40 PETERSFIELD, 50 MINS

An ancient market town with a vibrant musical and artistic scene. A pleasant place for shopping, eating and enjoying the regular markets.





41 HIGH BEECHES WOODLAND AND WATER GARDEN, 50 MINS

27 acres of woodland, water gardens, and a collection of rare, exotic and award-winning plants.

Uncover the secrets of the world-famous gin on the site of a former paper mill in the Hampshire countryside. Tours and experiences available.



53 BUCKINGHAM PALACE, 1 HR

A working royal palace that's the focus of royal celebrations and the backdrop to the regular Changing the Guard ceremony. The magnificent State Rooms are open to explore each summer (July-October).

56 BRIGHTON, 1 HR 10 MINS

With its majestic Regency squares and crescents, iconic Royal Pavilion and famous piers, Brighton is well-known for being a welcoming and diverse city with a passion for culture, creativity and sustainability as it is for its historic landmarks.

58 OXFORD, 1 HR 10 MINS

Home to scholars for more than 800 years, Oxford has Britain's oldest university and a wealth of other historic attractions. Admire the architecture of the City of Spires before discovering its eclectic food scene, meandering waterways and lush green spaces.

59 PORTSMOUTH, 1 HR 10 MINS

The UK's only island city, Portsmouth is the birthplace of Charles Dickens and home of the Royal Navy. With world-class attractions, miles of coastlines and centuries of history, there's plenty to discover.



61 ROTTINGDEAN, 1 HR 15 MINS

An ideal place to spend an afternoon browsing the shops and galleries, relaxing in Rudyard Kipling's gardens or taking tea in a traditional English tearoom.



60 SOUTHAMPTON, 1 HR 10 MINS

A lively, modern city with a strong connection to the sea, and is known as the cruise ship capital of Europe. There's plenty of shops, eateries and parks, and a fascinating history to explore.

62 DIDCOT RAILWAY CENTRE, 1 HR 15 MINS

A unique collection of Great Western Railway steam locomotives, carriages, wagons, buildings and small artefacts in the 21 acre living museum set around the original 1932 Engine Shed.

This historic cathedral city combines all the attractions of a thriving urban centre with the remains of Roman streets, walls and gateways.




65 STONEHENGE, 1 HR 20 MIN

66 ARUNDEL, 1 HR 20 MINS

Arundel captures the essence of heritage, urban chic and country pursuits – combining one thousand years of history with shops, restaurants and attractions.

67 SWINDON, 1 HR 30 MINS

A modern town surrounded by countryside and famous attractions. Enriched with Victorian parks and gardens, museums including the award-winning STEAM Museum, an art gallery and plenty of shops.



68 SIDDINGTON PARK, 1 HR 30 MINS

Rangeford's stunning retirement village in Cirencester, the capital of the Cotswolds.

69 SALISBURY, 1 HR 30 MINS

A modern, medieval town steeped in history. With a delightful market square and traditional shopping streets leading to the stunning cathedral, which houses the world's oldest clock and the Magna Carta.



71 BLETCHLEY PARK, 1 HR 30 MINS

Once the top-secret home of the World War Two Codebreakers, Bletchley Park is now a vibrant heritage attraction.

Set in 5,000 acres of rolling parkland, Waddesdon has one of the finest examples of a late Victorian garden in Britain.
